



## Farm & Agricultural Safety General Checklist

## Do a safety walk-around monthly. Look for:

- Moving equipment/parts/processes/people that could result in collision, compression or impact.
- Objects that can fall or drop from above.
- Chemicals or potentially harmful dusts, mists or fumes that can be inhaled.
- Rolling or pinching objects or machinery processes that could crush body parts, catch hair, or snag loose clothing.
- Electrical hazards from equipment, wiring or utilities.
- Presence or use of sharp objects that could cut or pierce the body.
- □ Hot or cold surfaces that could cause burns or freezing.
- Fire and eye hazards from welding, cutting, brazing, lasers or other sources.
- □ Any tools or equipment that can generate flying debris, harmful dusts, vibration, repetitive motion, or noise.
- Processes involving mixing or pouring of hazardous chemicals.
- Work areas that may create hazardous conditions, such as chemical storage near electrical panels.
- Material handling involving pushing, pulling, or lifting on a regular basis.
- □ Loud noises that could affect hearing.
- □ Hazards from handling fuels, cleaners, pesticides, herbicides, fungicides.
- Tasks that can amputate, crush, pinch, puncture or otherwise injure hands, arms, legs or feet.
- □ Working surfaces that can be slippery or wet.

## When you identify hazards, use the hierarchy of controls to reduce the risk of injury, illness or death. Scan the QR code for more information.
